Joseph joins Mary

Third Reading: Matthew 1 v 18-24

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about . His mother Mary was engaged to marry Joseph, but before they married, she learned she was pregnant by the power of the Holy Spirit. Because Mary's husband Joseph was a good man, he did not want to disgrace her in public, so he planned to divorce her secretly.

Eighth Reading: Matthew 2 v 1 -12

Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem in Judea during the time when Herod was king. When Jesus was born, some wise men from the east came to Jerusalem. They asked "Where is the baby who was born to be the king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him"

When King Herod heard this, he was troubled, as were as all the people in Jerusalem. Herod called a meeting of all the leading priests and teachers of the law and asked them where the Christ would be born. They answered, "In the town of Bethlehem in Judea. The prophet wrote about this in the Scriptures: "But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are important among the tribes of Judah. A ruler will come from you who will be like a shepherd for my people Israel".

Then Herod had a secret meeting with the wise men and learned from them the exact time they first saw the star.
