Gospel Reading - John 21 vv 1 - 19

Alleluia, Alleluia.

I am the first and the last, says the Lord, and the living one; I was dead, and behold I am alive for evermore.

All Alleluia.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

After these things Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.' They said to him, 'We will go with you.' They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them,

'Children, you have no fish, have you?' They answered him, 'No.' He said to them, 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the lake. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.

When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Tend my sheep.' He said to him the third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, 'Do you love me?' And he said to him, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus

said to him, 'Feed my sheep. Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.' (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, 'Follow me.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

The Sermon

The Creed

Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.

Sara Wrightson writes:

In January this year I spent four weeks in Fukuoka, on the island of Kyushu, Japan. During my time I looked for an Anglican church and found a warm welcome at St. Paul's Fukuoka. http://snkkztesthp.web.fc2.com/

I initially went along on a Tuesday evening, which was the day of my uncle's funeral. There was a service listed and I wanted to have a moment for prayer. It transpired that a new church was being built adjacent to the old one, and on this Tuesday the service had been cancelled because they were moving items from the old to the new. I explained why I had come, and a man, who turned out to be the priest, invited me into the church and to take as much time as I wanted.

The worship area was on the 1st floor (2nd floor in Japan). It was a peaceful space, and as I sat in the pews I looked towards a lovely stained glass window

above the altar. On the day a heavy granite font was being hoist-lifted down the stairs, quite a feat.

After my prayers, I thanked them and said I would attend the service that Sunday. By Sunday, the font had been positioned in the new church, the pews brought down, and the stained glass window installed above the new altar.

I attended two services here, and was warmly welcomed on both occasions. The services were conducted in Japanese. I was given an English translation, and joined in the service and the hymns in Japanese. (The hymns were written in Kanji, with the phonetic script of Hiragana, which I can read, so I could sing along.)

As we have at St. Hilda's, there were sidespeople to welcome worshippers, and once a month they have a parish lunch, which was being held on my first visit. The food was a typical Japanese bento box, very tasty. It was lovely to share a meal and sit and chat, in Japanese and English. The joy in being part of worship, with the welcome of so many, in particular Makie (who's taken the Christian name of Hilda) and Kiyoko.

The consecration ceremony of the new church building was on Saturday, 26th April. Please pray for this church, the family of St. Paul's Fukuoka, the community of Fukuoka, and for their work and worship.
